NEASPEC facilitates transboundary cooperation to conserve wildlife in North-East Asia, with focus on its six flagship species (Amur tiger, Amur leopard, Snow leopard, Black-faced spoonbill, White-naped crane and Hooded crane), by ensuring their survival and enhancing coordinated conservation mechanisms based on the NEASPEC Nature Conservation Strategy.

MIGRATORY BIRDS

Facilitate the joint monitoring activities of migratory birds and their habitats into a unified ecological community through:

- linking multiple countries and transcending borders

Examine cases for better management of key transboundary areas for environmental cooperation to call for coordinating efforts. Some flagship initiatives include:


