


NEASPEC NORTH-EAST ASIAN SUBREGIONAL PROGRAMME FOR ENVIRONMENTAL COOPERATION







Activities:


- 1. Implement the **strategy for habitat conservation and rehabilitation** of migratory flagship species
- 2. Strengthen **linkages between policy framework and scientific basis,** and improve harmonization of data, methods and techniques, to conserve Amur tigers and leopards in transboundary areas
- Strengthen bilateral and multilateral, and multi-level <u>cooperation and capacity</u> (information exchange and joint study among national stakeholders)
- Support <u>coordination</u> among major stakeholders to improve existing transboundary ecological corridors and facilitate the establishment of <u>transboundary protected areas</u>
- 5. Promote dialogue and cooperation with **multilateral mechanisms**
