



Expert Group Meeting on Promoting Transboundary Cooperation among Protected Wetlands in the Tumen River Estuary

15 May 2020 (Seoul Time)

Background

This Expect Group Meeting offers an opportunity to deliberate with country and international partners as ESCAP is forging an initiative and partnership on transboundary cooperation on wetlands between China, Russia and DPRK in the Tumen River Estuary.

In May 2019, UNESCAP East and North-East Asia Office, in the capacity of the Secretariat of North-East Asian Subregional Programme for Environmental Cooperation (NEASPEC), worked with national experts from China and the Russian Federation to develop a preliminary study on transboundary cooperation among protected wetlands in the Tumen River Estuary. The study aims to review the conservation of targeted sites¹ and their socio-economic conditions, evaluate the feasible steps towards strengthening and institutionalizing the transboundary cooperation among the protected wetlands, and develop concrete recommendations.

As this preliminary study has entered into the stage of finalization, experts are invited to a virtual meeting to review the key findings and recommendations of the report and deliberate on the way forward to promoting transboundary cooperation among countries and partners.

Objectives

- **a.** Valid the conclusion and recommendations of the draft preliminary report;
- **b.** Develop tangible ideas and proposed activities to be further operationalized under NEASPEC.

The meeting will be composed of two sessions, including a session for report authors to fine tone the recommendations and an extended session to review the findings and
