





- Agrees on actions by the Site Partnership for the upcoming year
- Finds ways to celebrate





### **Example - Site Activity and Work Plan Framework**

Objectives from the EAAFP Strategic Plan	Activities your Site plans to undertake over the coming year
Objective 1 Development of the Network of Sites	<ul> <li>Create a Site Partnership</li> <li>Hold a meeting to create a Work Plan</li> </ul>
Objective 2 CEPA	Hold a festival to celebrate migratory birds returning to breed in Spring, gather teachers together to understand the value of wetlands so they can teach their students
Objective 3 Research and Monitoring	<ul> <li>Connect with a local university to analyse the results of citizen monitoring results</li> <li>Connect with another FNS</li> </ul>
Objective 4 Capacity Building	Ask the Secretariat to recommend an expert to hold a workshop on monitoring for the Asian Waterbird Census
Objective 5 Flyway-wide Approaches	Identify which species your site would like to monitor in its migration to other sites on the Flyway. Ask the Secretariat to assist with contacting relevant sites

- 2. Management actions for existing Flyway Network Sites
- 3. Recommendations from the Conservation Status Report 1 (2022)
  - Limitations in knowledge about the distribution, size estimates, and trends of the populations
  - Strengthening existing monitoring programmes, establishing new monitoring programmes >> require local and national & international stakeholder engagement
- 4. Translations of key documents into national languages
- 5. Develop more Flyway projects
