#### **Draft Concept Note**

Capacity-Building Workshop on Addressing Desertification and Land Degradation in North-East Asia: Impact of Climate Change and Sectoral Policies

### 24-26 September 2025 Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia

#### **Background**

Desertification and land degradation (DLD) pose major threats to sustainable development in North-East Asia, severely affecting ecological health, economic sustainability, and community livelihoods. Concomitantly, climate change further exacerbates droughts and land degradation, increasing the risks of displacement, resource scarcity, and food insecurity. While desertification is a critical concern for the sustainable development of arid and semi-arid areas, addressing land degradation more broadly is essential for preserving biodiversity and ecosystem services, as well as for ensuring long-term food security, climate resilience, and sustainable livelihoods.

Recognizing these growing challenges, the 27<sup>th</sup> Senior Officials Meeting of the North-East Asian Subregional Programme for Environmental Cooperation (NEASPEC) held in Beijing in December 2024, emphasized the need for targeted capacity-building initiatives and policy dialogue to address DLD in the subregion.

In response, the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP), through its East and North-East Asia Office (SOENEA), is implementing a project titled "Strengthening the Capacity to Address Desertification and Land Degradation for Sustainable Development in North-East Asia". This project is part of ESCAP's Regional Programme of Technical Cooperation (RPTC) and aims to strengthen the capacity of government officials and stakeholders and promote regional cooperation to combat DLD.

The Capacity-Building Workshop is scheduled to take place from 24 to 26 September 2025. On the first day, participants will attend a Subregional Forum on Desertification and Land Degradation, jointly organized with the National Forest Agency of Mongolia and the DLDD-Northeast Asia Network (DLDD-NEAN). The Forum will provide an

opportunity to gain insights into the desertification and land degradation policies of North-East Asian countries and to learn about recent research findings. The following two days will be dedicated to **technical sessions** aimed at enhancing participants' knowledge and capacity on the subject. The workshop will promote technical and policy knowledge-sharing, strengthen stakeholder engagement, and support the development of collaborative initiatives in North-East Asia, contributing to broader regional efforts, including preparations for the 17th Conference of the Parties (COP17) to the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD), which will be held in Mongolia in 2026.

#### **Objectives**

- Enhance the technical and policy capacity of North-East Asia government officials and relevant stakeholders to address DLD and climate change impacts.
- Promote the exchange of knowledge, experiences, and good practices in sustainable land management in the subregion.
- Facilitate dialogue and strengthen regional cooperation mechanisms to address DLD.
- Promote joint initiatives and actions among countries in North-East Asia.

#### **Expected Outcomes**

- Improved knowledge and technical capacity to address DLD.
- Enhanced policy dialogue and coordination, including the sharing of good practices and identification of opportunities for joint actions.
- Strengthened subregional networks to support ongoing cooperation on DLD.

#### **Targeted Participants**

- Government officials from forestry, environmental, agricultural, and sustainable development agencies.
- Experts from UN agencies and regional institutions.
- Representatives of research institutes, civil society organizations, and international partners.
